Dear Parishioners and Friends

On Thursday we celebrated the feast of St Benedict one of the great saints of the western Church. His influence since the sixth century has been profound but my celebration of the feast took a slightly different turn from the ways in which monastic houses usually celebrate the feasts of their patron saint: I accompanied the Chamber Choir of St Bede's Catholic High School to a Mass in the Metropolitan Cathedral. This was for the annual Mass of thanksgiving for all those men and women who have devoted their lives to Catholic education in the archdiocese. The young people from St Bede's had been invited to lead the singing – and they did so to the acclaim of Archbishop Malcolm and the whole congregation. Celebrating the sacred liturgy with dignity and reverence was certainly an appropriate way to mark the feast.

Archdiocese Gillespie, Rector of the Beda College in Rome and a priest of Liverpool Archdiocese, wrote about St Benedict in this month's Catholic Pic. I am interested in what he has written about St Benedict as a non-Benedictine!

Benedict was born in the central Italian mountain town of Norcia (Nursia) around 480 AD and spent some time in Rome as a student. However, finding the Roman life too much for him, he went firstly to Subiaco and then to Monte Cassino, where he put the final words to his Rule of Life which he wrote for those who, like him, wanted to live a life of work and prayer.

There is a radio programme on the BBC called the Listening Project which had as its strapline "It's surprising what you hear when you listen." There is a sense in which the project which people call synodality could be presented at its roots as a project of respectful listening – listening, as St Benedict puts it in the prologue to his Rule of Life, with "the ears of the heart."

When in 1964 Pope Paul VI declared Benedict to be a patron saint for all of Europe, he reflected on him in the following way: "Messenger of peace, moulder of union, teacher of civilisation, and above all herald of the religion of Christ and founder of monastic life in the West."

Peace, unity and civility

The gifts of peace, of unity and civility are virtues which any nation should seek to foster, and which will fruitfully begin with each one of us in our everyday living. Benedict advises monks, and also speaks to us, with the message to place the love of Christ at the foundation of everything you do, having Him as the goal and purpose of your living. In short: prefer nothing to the love of Christ. Is this pie in the sky? Unattainable idealism? Or a vision where peace, unity and civility can thrive because they are firmly founded?

As GK Chesterton wrote: "Christianity has not been tried and found wanting; it has been found difficult and therefore not tried."

St Benedict, pray for us.
