Dear Parishioners and Friends

Recently, I picked up some notes I made from an article I read on the Psalms some years ago. Re-reading them I have found them quite helpful, especially this week when today's reading is from the Gospel according to St Mark where Jesus is talking about his own future suffering. My jottings:

Why do we sing psalms of lament? They take up two thirds of the psalter and often express anger, fury and a wish for vengeance. They often emerge from experiences of human suffering and moral injury. The biblical world was undoubtedly savage — murder, enslavement and slaughter. Wouldn't we be better off singing psalms that uplift us, convey good news, tell us just to trust in God? Well, uplifting liturgies cannot be fully received in our world without lament. We have to learn to sing an honest, aching lament because at the heart of the Christian life is the paradox of suffering, death and resurrection.

I certainly find these 'cursing' psalms comforting, for most of us do get angry with God or can't understand how God can 'allow' atrocious deeds and deep suffering. We can make these psalms our own – because usually they end in recognizing that God sees the whole picture while we live on our own little patch.

Another way of praying these psalms is to pray them on behalf of victims, to pray in solidarity by giving voice to the unspeakable. They can become prayers of self-reflection; we are praying with Jesus, just as he prayed these very psalms all those years ago; and we end our communal prayers by saying aloud, 'Amen', 'So be it'. In prayer we must be honest with God. Only then will we realize we are 'transformed sinners' and are face to face with a God who loves us unconditionally.
