Dear Parishioners and Friends

Benedictine monks for hundreds of years have followed the Rule of St Benedict, a little rule that we have written for beginners (as St Benedict described this Rule) embarking on the Christian way of monastic life. As I have often reminded you, monks from my monastery, Douai Abbey, have been serving both our parishes since before 1732. People sometimes can't understand how a monk can work here in Ormskirk and Scarisbrick 200 miles from his monastery when the popular image of monks is that they don't venture beyond the boundaries of the monastic grounds and spend their days making wine – and drinking it!

When I was in Lourdes in July, on the archdiocesan pilgrimage to Lourdes, some of our young parishioners asked me to take them on a visit to Douai, so last Sunday I drove 3 on them to the monastery for a 3 day stay. They joined in our prayers, did some valuable work sweeping floors and rousing spiders from their webs, as well as walking in the beautiful countryside. Their visit gave me the opportunity to reflect on what the purpose of monastic life is. It is easy to live day to day and sometimes become so caught up in doing to the neglect of taking stock of being.

In a simple way I like to think that a monk or nun is a person who does his or her best to dedicate their lives to God by a life of prayer in community – prayer and community, they go together, praying with one's brothers and sisters, living and working with them knowing that community life has its moments.

Prayer is at the heart of a monastic's life and enables them to undertake any works that a community and its individuals are asked to do. A monk, therefore, is well equipped to work away from home, as we who live in our monastic parishes know.

Please yourselves pray for our community at Douai that the Lord will enable us to continue the work he has asked us to do and that he will send men to join us in our mission to the Church in England and Wales.
