At a conference I attended recently the following reflection came to my attention. I couldn't find who it came from, but I think it is worthy of attention.

Reflection

Many people speak of vocation as if it were a one off. You may have a vocation to be a priest, a religious, a mother or father, but I'm sure that God is calling you to something even larger than any of these.

Vocation calls us out where we are to something new and often undreamt-of until that moment. Vocation, like life, evolves and changes. God does not call us at once but many times. Few of us are called to fulfil the same work for us forever.

Gods call is ever one that beckons us out from where we are, from our entrenched positions and our false securities, that we may take risks and brave adventures in his world. God's call is expansive and asks us to be outgoing. God's call is life-extending is to all people, in all places, at all times. It is amazing how we want to limit God to the things we want to do and the people with whom we agree.

It is too easy for the Church to get caught up in its own survival, its own renewal and restoration. These good things are necessary, but they must not be ends in themselves. What applies to individuals, apply to the Church.

"They who would save their life will lose it. They who loses their life for Christ will save it".

We are called to move out. The Church is called to mission. To reach out. We are the Church.

At all times we are called to restoration and revival. We need revival and rededication, but not in our "spiritual" lives only. God is concerned with the city and politics, with nations as much as with the Church. We belittle our God if we think God only wants us to work within the confines of the Church or in the established order.

Salvation is not just about soils. It's also about communities and nations, about peace and justice. When God calls, we are to respond.
