#### **Dear Parishioners and Friends**

It is a week since it was announced that Bishop John Sherrington, at present an auxiliary bishop in the archdiocese of Westminster, will succeed Archbishop Malcolm as the new archbishop of Liverpool. His installation will be on Tuesday 27 May. From all that I have heard Bishop John's nomination has been greeted with great joy. I hope that we shall soon be able to welcome him to St Anne's and St Elizabeth's parishes.

Was it by chance that last weekend we received the letter, via Archbishop Malcolm, on the Assisted Dying bill currently going through parliament? I think I am correct in saying that Bishop John, who currently deals with ethical and moral issues on behalf of the Bishop's Conference, was the guiding hand behind that letter. He clearly stated our Catholic Christian objections to this bill, not only for the ethical issues the bill raises, but also for the flawed procedures that seem to have dogged the bill since it was introduced into parliament. I was especially taken aback when the archbishop's letter mentioned that more time was spent debating the ban on fox hunting than it is spending debating bringing in assisted suicide.

We are asked to contact our member of parliament and ask him or her 'to vote against this bill not only on grounds of principle but because of the failure of parliament to approach this issue in an adequate and responsible manner.' There are times when it is important that we stand up for our Christian principles; I'm sure this is one of those occasions.
